
Additional Graduation Requirements:

- Post secondary assessments (TSI, PSAT, SAT, ACT, ASVAB).
- Application to a post secondary institution.
- CPR
- Peace Officer Instruction
- Financial Aid Application (FAFSA/TASFA)
- Volunteer service hours (20 per year).





Senior Interviews





Counselors are meeting with every senior to discuss students' progress towards graduation and any items pending.

A copy of the senior interview form was given to each student. Please ask your child to review their copy with you.





Volunteer Service Hours

- Students are required to complete 20 hours of community service hours for every year they are in YISD high schools in order to participate in the graduation ceremony. (80 total)
- It is the <u>student's</u> responsibility to get the blue form, get it signed and turned in to Mrs. Herrera in the counselor's office.







Attendance and LOC

- <u>STATE LAW</u> requires that students MUST be in attendance at least 90% to earn credit for their classes.
- Students cannot reach their full potential if they are not present in the classroom for instruction.
- Excessive absences, tardies, or early outs will result in a <u>court referral</u>.
- Warning will be issued after 3 unexcused absences and an attendance contract will be started by the administrator, parent, and student.
- <u>Loss of credit</u> due to absences occurs when a student exceeds the allowable number of unexcused absences, typically 10% of class days, which can result in the student being denied credit for a course, even if they have passing grades.
- Please call attendance at 915-434-3010 when your child will be absent.





Truancy and Prevention Measures

- TEC § 25.095: If a student has unexcused absences on three days or parts of days within a four-week period, or 10 days in a 6-month period, the student is subject to truancy prevention measures.
- Truancy Prevention Measures:
 - Parent and Student Meeting
 - Impose a behavior improvement plan (45-day Plan)
 - Impose disciplinary action
 - Regular meetings/house visits with Truant Officer
 - Refer student to truancy court
- It is important that the absences be excused.

Ysleta ISD Policy

In accordance with this new law, YISD will permit students to use their cell phone if (1) necessary for implementation of an <u>individualized education plan</u>, a <u>504 plan</u>, or similar plan; or (2) due to a documented need based on a directive from a <u>qualified physician</u>.

We also understand that parents and guardians have an interest in readily communicating with our students in the case of an emergency. This is why YISD will allow <u>ALL students to use their personal devices during any school emergency.</u> <u>HIGH SCHOOL students will also be allowed to use their personal devices during their lunch period.</u>



DVHS Policy



- <u>Students are not</u> allowed to use cell phones or headphones during instruction/class.
- <u>Students are not</u> allowed to be out of class instruction with your cell phone/headphones.
- Students allowed to use it during transitions or lunch.
- All confiscated phones go into lockdown with the AP's until a parent comes to pick them.

IGC Process

What is the IGC Process?

• The Individual Graduation Committee (IGC) process is a pathway that allows students who have not passed one or two required STAAR end-of-course (EOC) exams to graduate if they meet certain additional requirements.

Eligibility for IGC:

- Student must have passed all required coursework for graduation.
- Student may have failed one or two STAAR EOC exams (Algebra I, English I, English II, Biology, or U.S. History).
- Student must not have failed more than two STAAR EOC exams.

Important Things to Remember:

- Only available for seniors.
- This process is only for students who have failed 1-2 STAAR exams—more than two failures will disqualify the student from the IGC process.
- The decision is based on the student's overall academic performance, not just test scores.
- This pathway provides an alternative to passing STAAR exams, but students must still show mastery of the subject content.





Endangering Graduation

Discipline

- Commits an offense that is serious enough to take this action.
 - Possession of drugs (includes vapes) and/or alcohol, vaping, sexual misconduct and assault.
- Placement in DAEP during the last 9 Weeks of School will be basis to not participate in graduation ceremony.

Loss of Credit

• Student does not meet the 90% attendance requirement or fails to engage or fulfill a LOC Plan.

Grades

- 140 Rule
 - Does not complete assignments or exams.

College Applications

- Complete at least three college applications (I will assist you with UTEP and EPCC; the third college will be your choice). The more schools you apply to, the greater your chances of receiping scholarshipal Please submit a copy of your college applications (excluding UTEP and EPCC) to the Go Center (CIQ2). Important Reminder College applications are a requirement for graduation!
- Deadline: November 31, 2025

Federal Student Aid Account

☐ To begin the FAFSA application process, you need to create a Federal Student Aid account. Both students and their parents/guardians must have individual accounts. If your parents or slibilings have previously attended college or completed FAFSA, they may already possess an account. FAFSA Application Completed & Processed

- The FAFSA (Financial Aid) for the 2026-2027 academic year will be available starting October 1.
 2025. Both students and parents are required to complete their individual applications and link their accounts. To assist families with any application challenges, FAFSA nights will be organized.
 Important Reminder: completing FAFSA is a graduation requirement!
- Priority Deadline: January 15, 2026

Ysleta Education Foundation (YEF) Scholarship

- Apply for the Ysleta Education Foundation (YEF) Scholarship! Last year, the District proudly awarded the YEF scholarship to 20 students from Del Valle High School. Let's aim to boost that number this year!
- Deadline: The deadline is yet to be determined, but it typically falls during the spring

Complete All Loss of Credit Hours

- Complete all Loss of Credit incurred during the spring semester of your junior year, as well as the fall and spring semesters of your senior year.

 All hours must be completed in order to graduate.
- Deadline for Spring 2025 hours: November 7, 2025
 Deadline for Fall 2025 & Spring 2026 hours: End of April 2026

College Entrance Exams

Consider taking or retaking college entrance exams like the SAT, ACT, and TSI. Be sure to send your scores to the colleges you have applied to or plan to attend.

Community Service Hours

☐ To fulfill your graduation requirement, complete at least 80 hours of Community Service. Be sure to stop by the counselor's office to check how many hours you still need and to turn in hours.

Award Letter Submissio

- Please ensure you submit all award letters (including financial aid, scholarships, and military) to the Go Center before your senior clearance. Total amount of scholarships will be read at graduation.
- Deadline: May 1, 2026 (The earlier, the better!)

TSIA2 = College Readiness

- TSIA2 (Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0) is a standardized test used in Texas.
- It determines college readiness in reading, writing, and math.
- Helps students and institutions identify areas needing improvement.
- Required for enrollment in college-level courses without remediation.







TSIA2 = College Readiness

- TSIA2 includes multiple sections: English Language Arts and Reading (ELAR), and Mathematics.
- ELAR: A score of 945 or higher with an essay score of 5 or higher.
- Math: A score of 950 or higher.
- Students not meeting these scores may be required to take developmental courses.







HB3 – Texas Law

TEXAS EDUCATION CODE § 28.0256

BEFORE GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL, EACH STUDENT MUST COMPLETE AND SUBMIT A FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) OR A TEXAS APPLICATION FOR STATE FINANCIAL AID (TASFA).







FAFSA OPENS OCT. 1ST!

HOW TO START:

- Creating an Federal Student Aid account is REQUIRED.
 - You need this account to do FAFSA, without account you cannot do the FAFSA form.
 - FSA ID Account/FAFSA is linked by Social Security Numbers meaning you will have one account forever
- Parents, If you have ever done FAFSA, even 20+ years ago, you will need to access that original account. FSA help desk are the only ones who can help you access your original account.
- Student and parent will need their own account created before completing FAFSA.
 - Parent can still create an account if they do not have a SSN, student is the only one who needs a SSN to create an account

WHAT YOU NEED TO CREATE FSA ID ACCOUNT:

- Individual email for student and parent
- Working phone number
- Social Security Number

ACCOUNT CAN BE CREATED BEFORE OCTOBER 1ST!







FAFSA OPENS OCT. 1ST!

WHAT YOU NEED FOR FAFSA FORM:

- FSA ID Account (both parent & student) must have already been created.

 Both student and parent Social Security Numbers.

 Parent can still complete form if they do not have a SSN.

 2024 federal income tax returns (including W-2s and other records of money earned).

 If parents work internationally, they will need tax information from that country.

 Records of any child support received.

 Current balances of checking and savings accounts.

 The net worth of your investments (stocks, bonds, real estate, etc.), excluding your primary residence.
- Records of any other untaxed income.

THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- FAFSA is done every year student is in college. The earlier you do it, the better chance student has of getting full Financial Aid and additional Grants from Universities.
- Students must go at least half time to college in order to be eligible for federal aid.

FAFSA Nights: Oct. 27, Nov. 10, and Dec. 15. All from 4:30-6:30 in the Commons!
